What are the Asian Para Games?

The Asian Para Games are an international sporting event organized by the Asian Paralympic Committee (APC), a regional committee of the International Paralympic Committee (IPC), and are, in principle, held every four years.

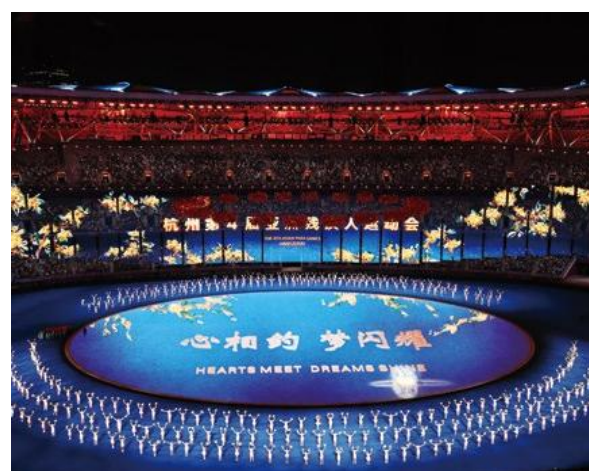


History of the Asian Para Games

The FESPIC Games (formerly the Far East and South Pacific Games for the Disabled), which were initiated by Japan as a sporting event for persons with physical disabilities in the Far East and South Pacific regions, were first held in 1975 and took place nine times through 2006.

Subsequently, building on the achievements of the FESPIC Games and with the aim of promoting the Paralympic Movement in Asia and further advancing competitive para-sports in the region, the Asian Para Games were established as a comprehensive multi-sport event for para-sports in Asia, with the first Games held in Guangzhou, China, in 2010.

The Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Games will mark the fifth edition of the Asian Para Games and the first time the Games are held in Japan.

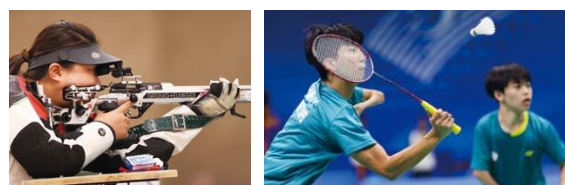

Games Overview

The hosting of Asian Para Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 (hereinafter referred to as the “Aichi–Nagoya 2026 Games”) will become the next major goal for the sports community following the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games, and will provide an opportunity to further deepen exchanges with the expanding Asian region. In addition to being a highly significant event for Japan as a whole, the Games will enable Aichi–Nagoya to play a leading role in disability sports in Japan and across Asia, thereby greatly contributing to the promotion of understanding of disabilities and the social participation of persons with disabilities, and ultimately to the realization of an inclusive society that respects diversity.

Games Emblem



The Games Emblem, which is the iconic symbol of the 5th Asian Para Games, describes the liveliness of sports with the smooth curves.

By using the design components of the Games Emblem of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026, this Emblem intended to collaborate with the Asian Games and expressed the burning passion of Para athletes in warm colors. It also represents the continuity of the passion, which will continue from the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games to future Asian Para Games.

Games Slogan

IMAGINE ONE HEART
こころを、ひとつに。

The Games Slogan concisely expresses the philosophy of the 5th Asian Para Games.

Hoping that you can imagine the passionate feelings of each and every Para athlete standing on the field through the Slogan and that everyone will unite their minds during the Games by encouraging them to imagine such feelings, this Slogan has been developed and designed.

Paired with the Slogan of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026, "IMAGINE ONE ASIA ここで、ひとつに。," these words further deepen its meaning.

Games Core Graphics



The Games Core Graphics serve as a symbolic visual representation of the 5th Asian Para Games, forming the foundation for unique designs used in the Games venues and city decorations.

The design is based on a layered composition that combines the arc, “Glory Bridge,” derived from the Emblem, with “Icons” representing the branding elements of Aichi and Nagoya.

Games Mascot



“UZUMIN,” the Mascot of the 5th Asian Para Games, was born from “water,” which has supported Aichi, the craftsmanship kingdom, becoming one with Shachihoko, the guardian deity of Aichi-Nagoya. The Name “UZUMIN” is based on the Japanese words “Uzu (whirlpool)” and “Izumi (spring),” expanding the concept of “water.”

It represents our hope that the passion of Para athletes will converge like a “whirlpool” and gather in Aichi-Nagoya and the excitement born there will well up like a “spring” and spread throughout Asia at the Games.

Sport Pictogram



Sport pictograms are visual symbols representing each sport, designed to transcend language barriers among participating countries. In addition to fulfilling their primary function of “communicating information,” they also serve as decorative elements that convey the Games’ image. They are used across various items, including the Look at the Games venues.

1. The Act on Prohibition of Unauthorized Ticket Resale

The Act on Ensuring Proper Distribution of Admission Tickets through the Prohibition of Unauthorized Resale of Specified Event Admission Tickets (commonly referred to as the Act on Prohibition of Unauthorized Ticket Resale) came into effect on 14 June 2019. Any unauthorized resale constitutes a serious criminal offence, which may result in fines or other criminal penalties.

The Organising Committee will conduct monitoring and investigations regarding the use of tickets and will take strict action against any individuals or organisations found to be in violation.

We kindly ask for your cooperation in handling and managing tickets with due care and in strict compliance with the prescribed rules.

2. Ticket Type

(1) Child Ticket

This is a discounted ticket for children under 15 years old as of the session date. Please note that age verification may be required at entry.

Child pricing is available only for the lowest seating category in each sport discipline. This ticket offers good value for families and groups attending together.

When children under 15 spectate together with companions aged 15 or over, the spectators aged 15 or over must purchase a General Ticket in the lowest seating category (e.g., for Wheelchair Basketball, spectators aged 15 or over must purchase a General Ticket of Category B, while the children aged 3–14 may purchase a Child Ticket).

*The lowest seat category is General Admission.

Children under 3 years old (not yet in school) may enter free of charge if seated on a guardian's lap. (A ticket is required if a seat is needed.)

If you wish to purchase seats other than the lowest seating category, children aged under 15 must purchase tickets at the standard price.

(2) Disability Discount Ticket

A discounted ticket is available for persons with a disability certificate and any number of accompanying persons. The disability certificate will be checked at the time of entry.

The discount is available only for the lowest seating category for each sport.

If you wish to purchase seats other than the lowest price category, please purchase a standard price ticket.

The lowest seating category is general admission (with some exceptions).

All accompanying persons must enter and exit the venue together with the ticket holder with a disability certificate.

Separate entry or exit is not permitted. There seating category, including higher categories, please purchase a ticket at the regular price, even if you hold a disability certificate.

2. Ticket Type

(3) Wheelchair Ticket

This ticket allows guests using a wheelchair and one accompanying person to attend the event together. (One accompanying person only.)

Wheelchair seating is available for all sessions.

The wheelchair user will be charged the Wheelchair Ticket price, and one accompanying person may attend free of charge. The accompanying seat will be located adjacent to the wheelchair space.

The accompanying person must enter and exit the venue together with the wheelchair user at the same time. Separate entry or exit is not permitted.

(4) Heartful Ticket

This is a special promotional ticket for groups of 2 to 4 people, including at least one senior (65+) or a person with a disability.

All members of the group may purchase tickets at the child rate for each session. Please note that valid ID (age verification or disability certificate) will be required at entry. Seating will be in the lowest available category.

3. Advance Registration of Accompanying Persons and Identity Verification

For certain sessions, including the Opening Ceremony and the Closing Ceremony, ticket purchasers are required to submit in advance the details of all attendees, including accompanying persons. Identity verification will be conducted at the time of entry, and admission may be denied if an attendee's identity cannot be confirmed. Thank you for your understanding.

If a violation of the above rules is identified, the Organising Committee may invalidate any tickets already sold and revoke the right to purchase tickets.

Ticketing Programme

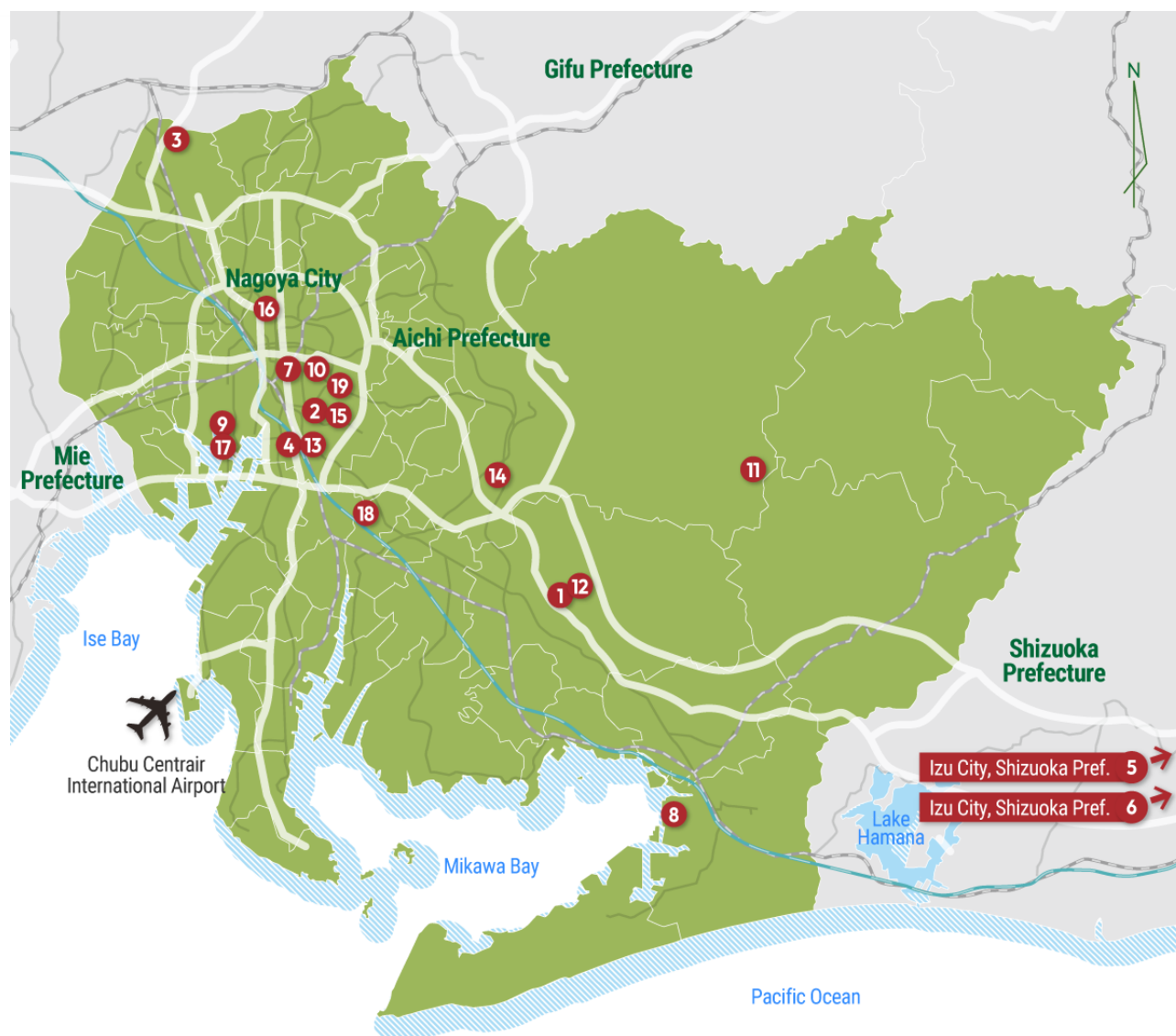

Spreading from Aichi–Nagoya to Asia! Let our “hearts” unite as “one.”

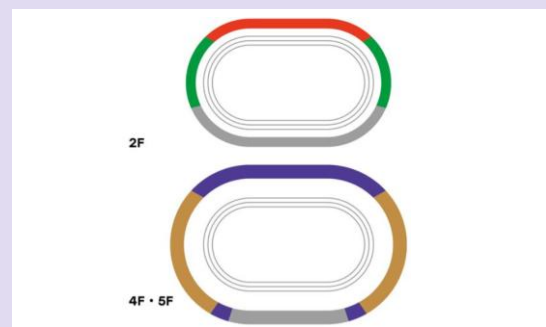

<<Guidelines for Opening and Closing Ceremonies>>

When attending the opening or closing ceremonies, prior registration of visitor information is required. Upon admission, identity verification will be conducted based on the registered visitor information. For details, please note the following:

■ Identity Verification at Entry

At the designated location, please show your admission ticket and valid identification document(s) to the staff. Acceptable identification document(s) is/are either of the following:

- ONE government-issued photo ID (e.g., Driver’s License, My Number Card, Passport, Disability Certificate, Student ID Card, Residence Card, etc.)
- TWO government-issued IDs without photo (e.g., Confirmation of Qualification, Pension Handbook, Pension Certificate, Copy of Residence Certificate, etc.)

※Please note that if you cannot show the above identification document(s) or cannot verify your identity, you will not be allowed to enter the event venue.

■ How to Register Visitor Information

Further details will be sent later to the email address registered on the website.

■ Notes for the Event Day

- During performances, admission will be restricted, and movement within the venue will be limited at certain times for production purposes.
- Please make sure to arrive by the specified time to be announced on the official ticket information website, for identity verification procedures.
- If you arrive after the specified time, your admission may be refused. Please note that tickets cannot be refunded in such cases.
- As admission procedures are expected to be very crowded, we kindly request your early arrival.

Para Badminton

Speedy chairwork and dynamic play

Badminton uses the same net height and basic rules as standard badminton, but some modifications are made depending on the type and degree of disability. The rackets and shuttlecocks used are the same as standard equipment. Players compete in two categories: wheelchair and standing,

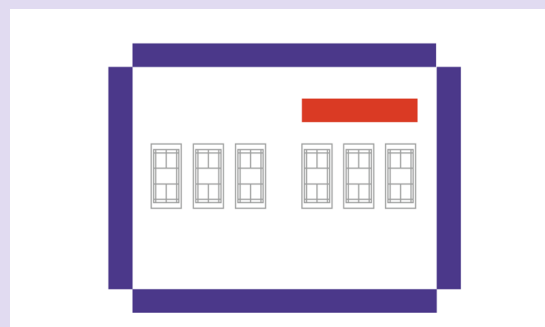
which are further divided into six classes based on the degree of disability.

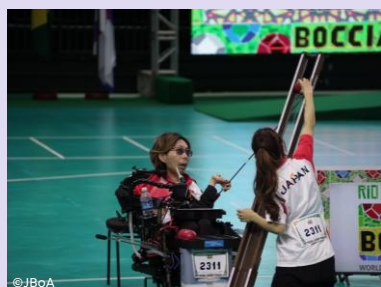

Boccia is a sport designed for athletes with disabilities, in which participants compete to see how close they can get six red and six blue balls to a white ball called the jack (target ball).

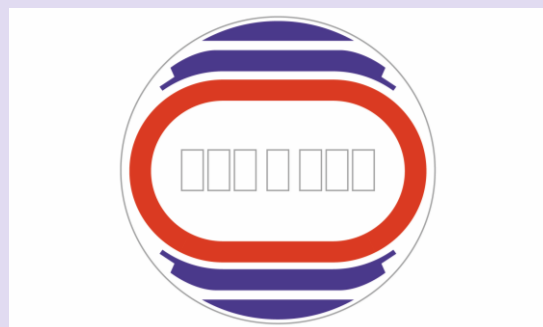
Even if a person has difficulty throwing the balls due to their disability, they can still participate by using a ramp (a ramp device) and communicating their intentions to the ramp operator.

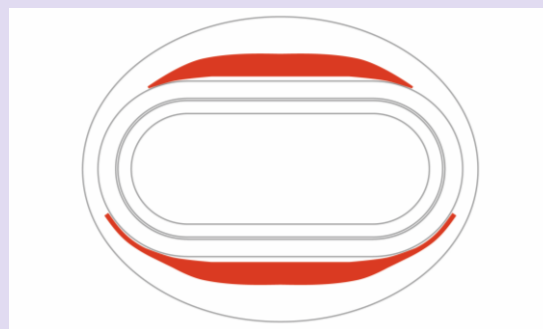

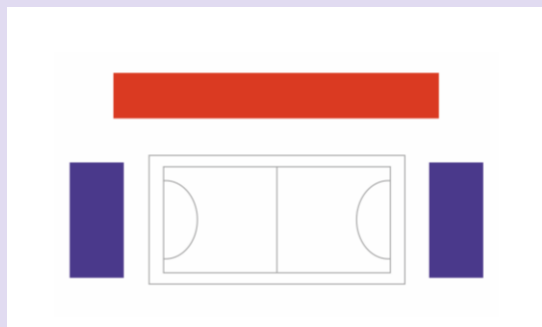
Often called "invisible football," all players except the goalkeeper wear eye masks and use a ball that makes a rattling sound.

Defensive players lie down to block balls that can travel up to 50 kilometres per hour, so the sport is also known as a "martial art in silence."

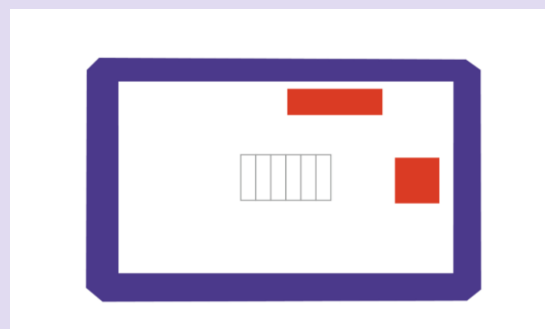

For athletes with visual impairments, tapping by a tapper can be allowed to prevent collisions with the wall.
